

#### **BGA Welcome Newest Members of Ahr Star Family**

On Thursday, October 5th, Bishop Ahr High School celebrated the 30th year of its Ahr Star program by hosting its annual Ahr Star Spaghetti Dinner. For the past 30 years, the Bishop Ahr community has adopted two children that are chronically or terminally ill, spending the entire year providing love and support for the families. This year, the Ahr Star Spaghetti Dinner, now in its 20th year, raised over \$9,000 for this year's Ahr Stars, with approximately 800 people attending, including students, parents, community members, alumni, and many former Ahr Stars. "The Ahr Star program is a true representation of the heart and generosity of the BGA community. It is truly love in action," said Sister Cynthia Babyak, Campus Minister and leader of the Ahr Star Program.

In July, the Bishop Ahr High School Ahr Star Committee proudly announced that the Ahr Stars for the 2017 - 2018 school year would be David Santos and Sadie Ally.

David is almost 1 year old. His mom is Jacquelyn Hegedus Santos and his dad is Jeremy Santos, both 2005 BGA alumni. "We feel so blessed by the overwhelming support of the Bishop age community," said the parents. Their son David was born with hypoplastic left heart syndrome and while there is no cure, the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia has provided hope with an innovative surgical approach to this type of heart disease. He has already undergone 2 open heart surgeries and more is to come.

Sadie Ally, the cousin of BGA alumnae Megan '16, Emily '16, and Elizabeth '13 Colagrande, is 4 years old and has a Wilms tumor and spots on her lung. She had one of her kidneys removed and continues to undergo treatment. Her brother Connor is 6 years old and her parents are Katie and Craig Ally. "It's an amazing program and we feel so blessed to be a part of it," said Katie Ally. All of the proceeds from the dinner are given to the Ahr Star's families to be used as they would like. At the dinner, David and Sadie were also presented with many gifts, but perhaps their favorite was a football autographed by the varsity boy's football team that was personally presented to the Ahr Stars.

The Ahr Star program at Bishop Ahr is perhaps the most popular service activity for students and faculty. This year, over 250 students and 50 teachers and administrators devoted their time to volunteering at the dinner. When asked about the Ahr Star program, Senior Kelly Harmon said, "It's a wonderful tradition and I'm proud to be a part of it every year. I'll really miss it when I go to college next year." Freshman Anna Caruso remarked that, "It was a phenomenal experience that I'll never forget." Ahr Star co-chairpersons Alexa Romanella '18 and Jude Roche '18 both stated that being able to run this program means the world to them. "It was the best night of my life and seeing them smile made everything worth it!" said Alexa. "It was a great night, I love Ahr star because it's so great to see our community come together," added Jude.

Members of the local community also got involved, with volunteers from the Woodbridge Knights of Columbus helping to cook the meals as they do every year. Also, past and present members of the BGA community donated their services to the dinner; the Roche, Penny, Dama, and Smith families all donated food to the dinner, which was in addition to the donations made by the student body. In fact, the donations were so great that the surplus spaghetti was donated to the Trenton Area Soup Kitchen, where many BGA students volunteer their time.

After the liturgy, Ahr Star Co-Chairs Jude Roche '18 and Alexa Romanella '18, along with members of Ahr Star Board and the Student Council, presented the Ahr Stars and their families with many gifts and tokens of support. All of the gifts were purchased with the money donated by the BGAHS students and monetary gifts were made possible by the money raised at the Spaghetti Dinner. Connor Ally also received special Christmas gifts!

The parents of both Ahr Stars then got up and spoke to the BGAHS community, thanking them for the Ahr Star program, and the love, prayers and support that has been given to them by the Bishop Ahr High School family. David's dad spoke about how meaningful the Christmas season is to them because that is the time that their son David was released from the hospital. And Sadie Ally's mom shared the amazing news that Sadie had finished chemotherapy, news that inspired a standing ovation and brought the audience to tears.

The Ahr Star families stayed to enjoy a special luncheon after which Sadie and the Ahr Star families spent time with faculty, staff, and students. Jude and Connor even played soccer on the hallway.

The Ahr Star Mass is always one of the most anticipated events of the year, and this year was no exception. It is a humbling and heartwarming experience that emphasize and reminds everyone what Christmas is all about. This year's celebration was no different and proved to be just that - a true Christmas celebration.

### In my own words....by Christopher Wilton '16

Over the summer I experienced a day that I will never forget. Many people may not know but when I was born I had open heart surgery at 6 days old at CHOP in Philadelphia. I was so young at the time that I have no memory of what transpired. My family would always tell me stories and show me pictures of me in the hospital. One person who was always mentioned in these stories was the man named Dr. DeCampli. My parents talked about how he was tall, skinny, and so kind to my family. He is the man who performed my emergency surgery and essentially saved my life. After hearing so many stories about him I wanted to meet him for myself! I never got to meet Dr. DeCampli because he moved to a hospital in Orlando Florida called Arnold Palmer Children's Hospital. Over the summer my family and I were going on vacation to Disney world in Orlando. During the time we were on vacation I asked if the hospital Dr. DeCampli worked at was far from where we were staying. Fortunately for us he wasn't far at all. We got in contact with his assistant and she said he would be so happy to meet with us after. My family and I drove to the hospital and his assistant met us in the lobby to take us to his office. We walked in and talked to assistant for a little while and then he walks in. He comes walking in tall, and skinny just as my parents described. He shook my mom, my dad, and my sisters' hands and when he came to me we stared at each for a couple of seconds both in shock to finally meet one another. He stops and says, "You must be Christopher" as he extends his hand. The only thing I could say to him was "thank you." I thanked him and told him how without him I would not be here today. It was an amazing feeling to finally meet him after 19 years and let him know how much he means to me and my family for giving me my life. When it was time to go I found myself saying goodbye with a big smile on my face for finally meeting someone who I consider a hero in my life. Dr. DeCampli was so kind to my family and meeting him is a day I will never forget.





#### Pamela Graboso Class of '04 takes to Nicaragua

My name is Pamela Graboso and I graduated Bishop George Ahr High School in 2014. I am currently a senior at New York University College of Dentistry studying dental hygiene. The summer before my senior year, I was chosen to go on a dental outreach through the NYU Dentistry Henry Schein Cares Global Outreach Program. This past September, I spent ten days in Granada, Nicaragua to improve oral health through service, education, and research.My dental team and I visited four different schools throughout Granada and gave oral health education to over 2000 school children. We also examined and put Silver Diamine Fluoride(SDF) on over 600 school children for research purposes to see the caries prevalence rate in the area.The purpose of Silver Diamine Fluoride is to arrest or stop the growth of caries, also known as cavities. During my two weeks there, I was alternating between giving oral health education and examining and putting Silver Diamine Fluoride on children. We were also able to partner with Colgate Latin America to help with replenishing the toothbrush supply for these school children.

We worked very hard during this outreach, which means we were able to play hard as well. On our days off, we were able to sight see and do tourist things around Granada. We hiked up around the inactive volcano called Mombacho. The sights were breathing taking. Next to Mombacho was Laguna de Apoyo, which was a volcanic crater that turned into a lake. We were able to swim and kayak around for the afternoon. Another day we did a boat tour of the Islets of Granada, the lake contains various islands. Some of these islands have animals such howler monkeys. We were able to see some of them as the approached our boat. After clinic one day, we went to see the active volcano, Maysa. We waited until it was very dark so that we could be able to see the lava. I have never seen an active volcano up close so it was a sight to see.


Being able to be immersed in Nicaraguan culture for ten days really make an impact on me. Upon returning back to New Jersey, I realized I took a lot of things for granted. There was no air conditioning or Wi-Fi. The plumbing is very sensitive and electricity is very expensive in Nicaragua. One of the big things I took for granted was the access to dental care. Access to dental care is difficult for majority of the people in Granada. There are very few people that have money to spare to seek dental care. If they have a toothache then they will go to the hospital and most likely the tooth will be extracted. Majority of the children that we examined had at least a cavity and has never seen a dentist. When these cavities are not taken care of with proper oral hygiene, it can cause pain and swelling. Sometimes we can save the tooth by cleaning out the decay and filling it with composite material or put Silver Diamine Fluoride, other times we have to extract a tooth or two.

Granada, Nicaragua has left a mark on my heart. I am forever grateful to be chosen to partake in this global outreach. This trip really helped chose that I wanted to have my focus in pediatrics for dental hygiene It really was a once in a lifetime experience. Granada will see me again.



# on having your book published.




